

My name is Nobuhisa Harada and I assumed my post as principal on April 1, 2023.

Nagayoshi High School values discipline and autonomy, does not allow bullying, and strives to create a school where students can feel at ease. In addition, as an empowerment school, Nagayoshi High School aims to conduct classes that encourage and motivate students to enjoy learning and to then develop qualities that can be adapted in society after graduation.

Our school was founded in 1975 as a full-time general high school. It was fully and enthusiastically received by the surrounding community. In 2001, it was changed to a full time credit based high school. A two semester system and 100 minute classes were introduced.

We have an emphasis on education for international understanding and as such there is a quota allowing for a number of students returning from overseas or recently arrived students.

All students entering must take an entrance exam. A Japanese language course is also offered for students who need language instruction.

In 2015, the school changed to an empowerment school (ES) and from then all students were required to wear uniforms.

This year we begin the 9th year of ES and in 2024 we will celebrate our 50th anniversary. As a pioneering high school in multicultural education, we aim to develop young people who can contribute to the realization of a symbiotic society, develop their individuality, and have a strong sense of human rights.
